



Project Name: Maitland Blvd Extension (SR-414)

Location: Orlando, Florida

Project Facts: The need for the roadway, initially called the Apopka Bypass, has been discussed for more than a decade. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) originally studied the corridor in 1998. A preferred alignment was selected in 1999, but the project stalled due to a lack of funding. In February 2004, the Expressway Authority assumed responsibility for the SR 414 extension from the FDOT. For the road alignment to be a part of the Expressway Authority system, it had to be converted to a limited-access toll road similar to SR 429. As a result, the original alignment selected in 1999 had to be modified via a Re-Evaluation Study which led to the current alignment.
